Jeffrey Floyd Coyan, age 51 of Jackson, passed away peacefully at his home on Saturday, July 4, 2015 while in the loving care of his children.

Coyan was born January 19, 1964 at the Oak Hill Hospital to Floyd (Boone) Coyan, Jr., and Joy Ellen Masters Coyan.

Jeffrey was survived by his sons, David Floyd (Lindsey) Coyan, Tyrus Wilson (Morgan Humphrey) Coyan and his daughter Cassandra Lynn (Riley Nickell) Coyan, as well as his grandchildren McKensy and Chloe Coyan, Dominic Floyd Coyan and Elaina Joy Nickell. He is also survived by two sisters.

He loved the children he coached as much as he did his own, and relished the opportunity to share his love of sports with those children.
