She had many wonderful moments and lived her life with no regrets.

Even though Katie lived a complex life with relentless health issues stemming from Spina Bifida, her desire to enjoy life, love her family, attend concerts, travel out west and her love of the arts kept Katie pushing for better days and solutions to obstacles she faced.

Resilient, stubborn, passionate, she handled unsavory moments with realistic and dark humor, often causing people to question the entire family's mental well-being. Katie never swayed away from her humor, enjoying the gasps and looks from others when she delivered her messages.

Katie loved her mom and dad deeply, they were Katie's biggest fan, greatest support, and provided lifelong loving care. She loved siblings through inevitable growing pains and she loved her nieces and nephews as her own. Katie loved her dog Quinn who proceeded Katie in death, and she leaves behind her fur baby Mable, that will bring comfort to all during this time.
