Tommy Allen (Tom) Cheek, age 68 of Jackson, Ohio passed away peacefully with family by his side on Feb. 20, 2025 at the OSU Hospital in Columbus following a short illness. He was born to Johnie & Elsie Lemaster Cheek in Jackson on March 4, 1956. Tom is a 1975 graduate of Oak Hill HS where he was captain of the football team & also a member of the track team. After graduation, he enlisted to serve in the U.S. Navy.

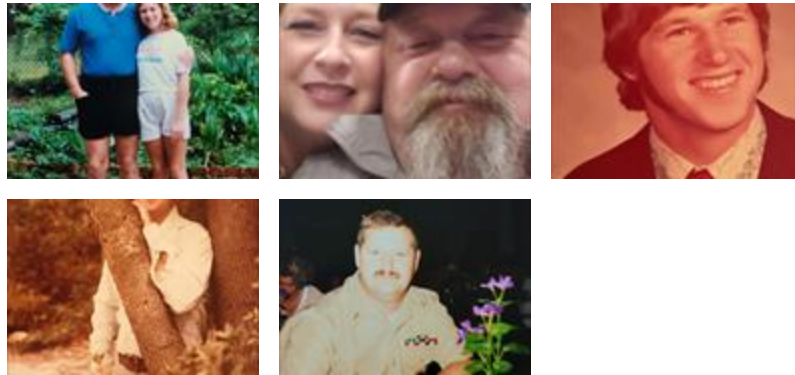
