



Wayne "Butch" Warren

August 19, 1951 - November 23, 2025

Wayne "Butch" Warren, a proud veteran of the 101st Airborne Division, known as the "Screaming Eagles," passed away peacefully at the age of 74 on Sunday, November 23, 2025, leaving behind a legacy of courage and dedication. He was born in Nelsonville, Ohio on August 19, 1951 to the late Charles and Lillian Warren. Butch served with distinction in Vietnam, where he was honored with a Purple Heart for his bravery after sustaining combat-related injuries. After his military service, he enjoyed a successful career at Goodyear, where he worked for 29 years until his retirement.

Butch is survived by his son, Wayne Warren Jr.; his beloved grandsons, Daniel, Austin and Justin; his former wife, Joanne (Castor) Warren; his recent girlfriend, Margie Nelson; and his brother, Mike. He was preceded in death by his grandson, Logan Warren, and his parents, Charles and Lillian (Bryan) Warren.

As the youngest of seven siblings, Butch cherished his family, including his brothers and sisters: Charles "Wimp," Tom, Danny Joe, Patty, and Dee.

A celebration of Butch's life will be arranged at a later date, as per family wishes. He will be cremated, with burial to take place at Greenlawn Cemetery in Nelsonville.

Butch will be remembered for his unwavering spirit, love for his family, and the
